

Fair Share Health Care

3 **WHEREAS**, 600,000 Washingtonians lack health insurance; and

4
5 **WHEREAS**, the Washington health care safety net, the Basic Health Plan (BHP) is
6 consistently searching for funding; and

7
8 **WHEREAS**, eligible, uninsured Washingtonians cannot receive benefits on the BHP as
9 there are not sufficient slots; and

10
11 **WHEREAS**, a 2004 report stated that more than 3,100 Wal-Mart workers, half of whom
12 work full-time, are on the taxpayer-funded BHP; and

13
14 **WHEREAS**, other large employers, such as McDonald's shift their health care costs to
15 taxpayers via the BHP; and

16
17 **WHEREAS**, employers currently have no incentive to not join in to the "race to the
18 bottom" by shifting their health care costs to taxpayers via the BHP; and

19
20 **WHEREAS**, the Fair Share Health Care bill (HB2517/SB6356) of 2006 would require
21 employers with 5,000 or more employees to spend at least 9% of their payroll on health
22 care, and non-profits would spend 7%; and

24 **WHEREAS**, Governor Gregoire committed to passing a "perfected" Fair Share Health
25 Care bill in 2007;

27 **THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Washington State Democratic Party join with
28 the Fair Share Health Care Coalition of church organizations, business leaders, unions,
29 and retirees in supporting Fair Share Health Care legislation in the 2007 Washington
30 State Legislative session in respectfully directing their Washington State delegation to
31 work to enact said legislation.
