**Resolution Urging Immediate Action** 1 In Support of the Marbled Murrelet 2 3 4 WHEREAS the marbled murrelet is a small seabird that nests in older coniferous forests 5 up to 50 miles from marine waters in western Washington, including in Jefferson 6 County; 7 8 WHEREAS the marbled murrelet's forest nesting habitat has been significantly 9 reduced, due mostly to timber harvest practices; 10 11 WHEREAS the marbled murrelet population in Washington has been declining by 12 approximately 7% per year for the past 10 years; 13 14 WHEREAS the loss of the marbled murrelet's nesting habitat is the primary reason for 15 the decline of the species; 16 17 WHEREAS the marbled murrelet is listed as a Threatened Species under the Federal 18 Endangered Species Act and a Washington State Threatened Species; 19 20 WHEREAS some of the highest quality marbled murrelet nesting habitat remaining in 21 Washington is located on State Trust Lands in Jefferson County that are administered 22 by the Washington State Department of Natural Resources; 23 24 WHEREAS Department of Natural Resources with agreement from the US Fish and 25 Wildlife Service developed a Habitat Conservation Plan (1997) that included interim 26 timber harvest policies to protect marbled murrelet nesting habitat with the 27 understanding that these interim measures would be superseded by a science-based 28 Long-Term Conservation Strategy; 29 30 **WHEREAS** the interim timber harvest policies on State Trust Lands do not provide 31 adequate protection for marbled murrelet nesting habitat and have resulted in the loss 32 of habitat that would have contributed to the survival and recovery of the marbled 33 murrelet; 34 35 WHEREAS Department of Natural Resources developed a Science Report (2008) that 36 includes recommendations for a Marbled Murrelet Long-Term Conservation Strategy; 37 38 WHEREAS the State Board of Natural Resources has not adopted a Marbled Murrelet 39 Long-Term Conservation Strategy; 40

41 WHEREAS the absence of a Long-Term Conservation Strategy has hindered the 42 Department of Natural Resources from delivering a predictable, sustainable, stable flow 43 of timber revenue from State Trust Lands that would benefit Jefferson County; 44 45 WHEREAS Jefferson County and its residents derive multiple benefit from State Trust 46 Lands and the existence of the marbled murrelet on those Lands; and 47 48 WHEREAS, support from Jefferson County may persuade the Board of Natural 49 Resources to adopt a Marbled Murrelet Long-Term Conservation Strategy; 50 51 THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Washington State Democratic Central 52 Committee call on the Washington State Board of Natural Resources to immediately 53 adopt a Long Term Conservation Strategy, based on the Department's 2008 Science 54 Report recommendations for Jefferson County, which will fully meet the marbled 55 murrelet protection agreed to in the Department's 1997 Habitat Conservation Plan; and 56 57 **THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Washington State Democratic 58 Central Committee further call on the Jefferson County Board of Commissioners to 59 immediately request that the Washington State Department of Natural Resources 60 promptly implement the above referenced Long-term Conservation. 61 62 63 Submitted by the Jefferson County Democrats to the WSDCC.
