Forest Land Resolution

- 2 WHEREAS the commons in the United States have shrunk considerably; much like the commons
- 3 in England have as a result of the Enclosure Acts;
- 4 WHEREAS timber companies, and DNR and National forest and other public lands now require
- 5 special passes and/or permits to be purchased for entrance to said land;
- 6 WHEREAS many people cannot afford these fees for access to land the people already own, and
- 7 cannot afford the permits to enter private timber land, thereby American Citizens are denied
- 8 access to land and activities enjoyed by generations of Americans;
- 9 WHEREAS we respect private ownership of all individual citizens, farmers and small timberland
- 10 owners;

- 11 WHEREAS Washington State residents are the "owners" of the wildlife, and water that timber
- 12 companies, DNR, and the National Forest deny access to;
- 13 WHEREAS timber companies enjoy property tax reductions, and fire protection placing
- 14 unreasonable financial burden on the public;
- 15 WHEREAS timber companies activities negatively impact surrounding property, streams, people
- and air sheds causing further financial, environmental and health problems as well as other
- 17 harmful effects on the public;
- 18 WHEREAS activities such as slash burning are not confined to the property of the timber
- 19 company, as smoke permeates total air shed, causing health risks to people for which they are not
- 20 compensated nor has their permission been given;
- 21 WHEREAS streams silted up from timber company activities such as vegetation removal and road
- building, resulting in harm to fish runs and water quality in bays and rivers; and
- 23 WHEREAS these various costs are born by the public in general, without compensation, and that
- outdoor recreation is a requirement for public health and a human right;
- 25 **THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the Washington State Democrats call for timber companies
- to only receive tax reductions to the extent that the public enjoys the common good through public
- 27 access, and government agencies such as the DNR, National forests and other public lands
- eliminate fees for public access to lands already owned by the people.
