PROTECT THE GROWTH MANAGEMENT ACT

2 WHEREAS in 1990 at a time when there were 4,866,692 people in Washington, our state legislators recognized that "uncoordinated and unplanned growth, together with a lack of 3 common goals expressing the public's interest in the conservation and the wise use of our 4 5 lands, pose a threat to the environment, sustainable economic development, and the health, safety, and high quality of life enjoyed by residents of this state. It is in the public 6 interest that citizens, communities, local governments, and the private sector cooperate 7 and coordinate with one another in comprehensive land use planning. Further, the 8 9 legislature finds that it is in the public interest that economic development programs be shared with communities experiencing insufficient economic growth."; 10 WHEREAS in 1990 in response to these concerns the legislature created the Growth 11 Management Act (GMA) RCW 36.70A which includes 13 major planning goals devised 12 with implementation flexibility facilitated at the local level; 13 14 WHEREAS this visionary piece of legislation has enabled our great state to remain a beautiful and desirable place to live, work, and recreate; 15 16 WHEREAS in 2019 the population of Washington State increased to 7,666,343 with a predicted 2040 population of 9,235,561 almost double that of when the GMA was first 17 adopted; 18 WHEREAS this massive growth, if not carefully managed, threatens to cripple 19 20 infrastructure, consume agriculture and forest lands, destroy ecosystems, and to pollute our air and water; 21 22 WHEREAS there have been numerous and ongoing shortsighted efforts to sabotage and weaken the GMA under the false premise of making it more "flexible"; and 23 24 WHEREAS now more than ever the Growth Management Act is the most vital piece of legislation needed to maintain and protect our state's natural resources and quality of life, 25 and thus must be fiercely protected; 26 27 THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Washington State Democratic Party Central Committee calls upon our state legislators and relevant local jurisdictions to not sponsor 28 or support bills or policies that will weaken the Growth Management Act; and 29
