Rules for Election of Democratic National Committee Members

Pursuant to the Charter and Bylaws of the Democratic Party of the State of Washington, Democratic National Committee Members shall be elected by the State Central Committee for terms of four (4) years during each presidential election year. The following rules shall apply to such elections:

1. Four (4) members of the Democratic National Committee shall be elected by the State Central Committee at its first quarter meeting in each Presidential Election year. No more than two (2) of a binary gender shall be elected with a maximum difference between Male and Female positions being no more than one (1). Nominations and voting for these four (4) positions shall be conducted at the same time on one ballot for each round. The highest vote recipients who receive a majority shall be elected, provided that no more than two (2) persons of any binary gender category shall be elected, and that there can be no more than a difference of one (1) between Male and Female gender categories.

 2. All Candidates for the Democratic National Committee members shall be nominated and seconded by members of the State Central Committee, or by a Democrat holding a valid proxy for the meeting in which the vote is taken. Candidates must be registered voters of the State of Washington. A candidate need not be present to be elected but if not present must have filed a letter of intent with the State Chair prior to the meeting.

 3. Each candidate may use up to five (5) minutes on their own behalf for nominating and seconding speeches and a speech by the candidate, to include the time spent by the Chair in reading the letter for a candidate not in attendance. The five (5) minutes be allocated at the candidate's discretion.

4. After all candidates are nominated, the State Central Committee shall vote as follows:

a. *First ballot round*: To be counted in the first round, a ballot must have exactly four (4) positions filled with names of properly nominated candidates with no duplications and must vote for no more than two (2) of the same binary gender and the number of males and females cannot differ by more than one (1). The vote shall not be weighted. In order to be elected, a candidate must have a simple majority of the votes of those casting valid ballots. The highest vote recipients who also receive a majority of votes on the first ballot shall be declared elected to the extent that positions are available.

b. The candidates for the remaining positions will be the top unelected vote recipients, provided

The number of candidates advancing to the next ballot shall not exceed twice the number of positions available.
